**Here are some examples to help you:**

#### Article 1: Names and Aims

- The name of the society shall be “the University of Edinburgh Engineering Society”
- The aims of the society shall be to promote networking between the Engineering students of Edinburgh University, to improve links with industry between the society & its members and to provide academic support to those society members who require it during the course of their study.
- The society shall abide by any applicable laws, bye-laws and guidelines of the Edinburgh University Students' Association in relation to recognised societies.

#### **Names and Aims**

The society shall be called the **Biology Society** aka **BioSoc**.

A social and academic society for students interested in Biology, responsible for organising social and academic events such as an end of year ball and Hoodies.

#### **2) AIMS, BENEFITS, AND OBJECTIVES**

- 2.1. To promote the study and enjoyment of Philosophy within Edinburgh University, and outwith the community.
- 2.2. To engage renowned speakers to give talks to the Society on varying topics within the domain of Philosophy.
- 2.3. To provide and promote a link between Edinburgh University Philosophy Staff and Students.
- 2.4. To provide academic and moral support for all Edinburgh University Philosophy Students.
- 2.5. To provide a social forum for all Edinburgh University Philosophy Students.

#### **2. Aims**

- 2.1. The aims of the EUSDA are as follows:
  - 2.1.1. The association shall be representative of the aims and aspirations of the Sustainable Development degree programme.
  - 2.1.2. The association shall encourage cohesion between students and staff of Sustainable Development.
  - 2.1.3. To facilitate students in the learning of Sustainable Development by providing information and advice on, as well as organising, related courses, seminars and



workshops.

2.1.4. To engage with sustainable development on campus through a wide range of initiatives led by students.
